



Spiral sun-orchid

Scientific name: *Thelymitra matthewsii*

National status (EPBC Act 1999): **Endangered**

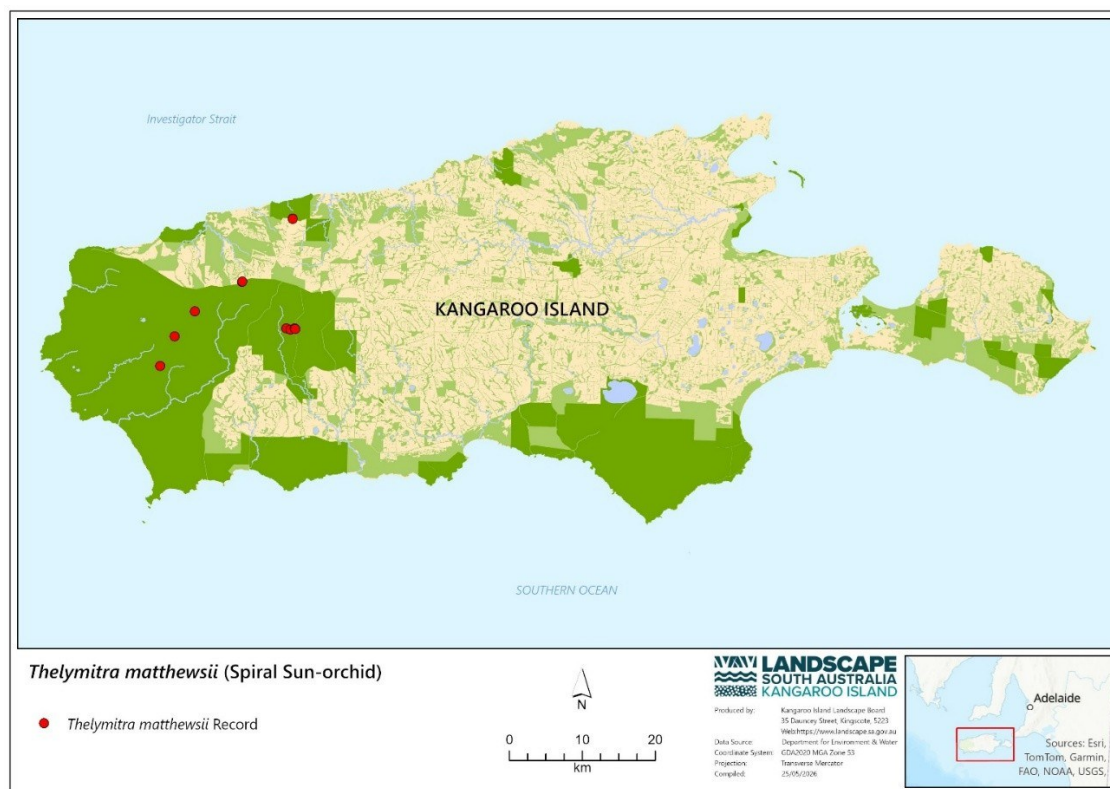
South Australian status: (NPW Act 1972): **Endangered**

Description:

Annual terrestrial orchid emerging in spring with a unique, easily identifiable, spirally twisted leaf to 6 cm long. Usually one, rarely two, flowers to 20 cm high. Flowers are purple to red with darker stripes and a yellow apex. Flowering between August and September.

Distribution:

Found on the Fleurieu Peninsula, Kangaroo Island and the South-east of South Australia. On Kangaroo Island it mainly grows on ironstone gravel within mallee heathland.



Specific threats:

Threats to *Thelymitra matthewsii* include vegetation clearance and disturbance (from road maintenance and fire prevention works), inappropriate fire regimes (lack of fire or too frequent fires), climate change and declining genetic viability due to a small and fragmented population.
